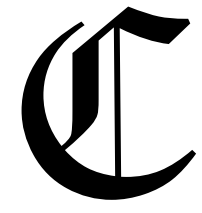
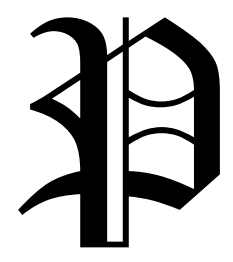
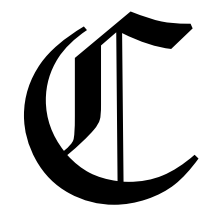

FUTURITY MATCH

1. Only puppies bred by members in good standing Pacific Coast Bulldog Club, Inc. are eligible.
2. The Futurity Match will be held at the August regular meeting.
3. The Bitch is nominated prior to breeding or no later than two (2) weeks after actual mating.
4. Nomination fee is ten dollars (\$10). No additional fees are required after the litter is born.
5. To keep the litter eligible the member must advise the Futurity Chairperson of the date and the number and sex of the puppies before puppies are sixty (60) days old or ten (10) days prior to judging of the Match, whichever comes first.
6. Puppies three (3) months and under fifteen (15) months old are eligible.
7. All fees to be paid to Futurity Chairperson.
8. Futurity Chairperson may show at this Match.
9. Puppies with points or Championship may show at this Match.
10. Puppies can only be shown once in a Futurity.
11. The breeder must be a member in good standing on date of the match for puppies to be shown.

DIVISION OF FUTURITY MONEY

12. Ten percent (10%) to be deducted for expenses.
13. Futurity Chairperson will purchase ribbons for First through Fourth Place.
14. The remaining money is to be divided as follows: First Place receives forty percent (40%), Second Place receives thirty percent (30%), Third Place receives twenty percent (20%), Fourth Place receives ten percent (10%).
15. The club will provide a Trophy to go to the Winner of First Place to be held for one (1) year. Permanent Possession will be after three (3) wins of First Place. Not necessarily in succession.

JUDGE WILL BE SELECTED ACCORDING
TO RULES FOR SELECTION OF JUDGES
SLATE OF JUDGE NOMINATIONS SHALL BE VOTED ON
TWO GENERAL MEETINGS PRIOR TO THE FUTURITY

MANNER WHICH ENTRIES ARE JUDGED

16. If the number of entries is less fifteen (15), then they are judges as one class, regardless of sex.
17. If the number of entries are fifteen (15) or more, the Class will be divided into Junior and Senior. Under and over six (6) months respectfully, regardless of sex.
18. From each Class the Judge selects the four (4) best entrants, then from the eight (8) finalists, the Judge awards First, Second, third and Fourth.

Heat Stroke and Bulldogs

All short-nosed breeds like the bulldogs and pugs must be carefully managed in very hot weather. It usually surprises novice dog owners how quickly a bulldog may succumb due to heat stroke. It is a severely underestimated cause of death in all breeds, not only bulldogs, but it is true that bulldogs are particularly susceptible to heatstroke.

So if the weather is hot, take great care. Exercise either early in the morning, or late at night. Bulldogs love sunbathing and will often lye in the full sun, with no ill effects, provided they are left quietly, and on their own, and can decide for themselves when it is time to move into the shade when required. Never, ever leave your dog in the car unattended in summer, NOT EVEN for a couple of minutes.

The first signs of heatstroke are: extremely rapid, heavy panting, and a blue colored tongue. It may get to the point where your bulldog is making peculiar noises in his throat; sides convulsive and refuses to drink water or lick ice. This will progress to 'roaring', a term used to describe when the dog is really in distress and struggling to breath. He may vomit a white froth or foam, which you must clear from it's throat with your fingers. At this point immediate action is required!

If your bulldog does not have the ability to vomit you must help him to clear his throat to ensure better air intake. In comparison to the size of the bulldog's head, their throats are small and it is possible for them to choke on their own phlegm. Wedging ice cubes between the dogs teeth helps reduce the swelling in the throat due to prolonged panting. You can reach in and pull the mucous out, or use lemon juice squeezed directly into the back of the mouth or pour a bit of soda containing acidic to cut all the phlegm loose causing the dog to vomit.

Once his throat has been cleared and air can now circulate up and down the trachea, his body temperature must be immediately reduced.

Heat Stroke and Bulldogs (cont.)

The most efficient way to reduce the body temperature is to totally immerse the heatstroke victim in a cold bath, or if that is not possible, to hose the dog with ice cold water. If you don't have enough ice-cold water at your disposal place a pack of ice cubes on top of your bulldogs head. If the dog is loosing consciousness, placing ice-cubes against the rectum can also help. Once the dog seems to recover, dry him and keep him in a cool place where he can relax. Give him small amounts of water to drink. Do not allow him to drink too much, as this will make him sick or cause him to choke on the froth produced.

In situations where heat may gradually build up, for example, when traveling or during summer shows, it is wise to take preventive measures. If you use a crate in the car, make sure it is the wire type so that plenty of air can circulate and use as a cooler a plastic bottle that you have previously filled with water and put in the freezer overnight. Prepare plenty of ice-cooled towels (that you have soaked in water, rolled up and placed in the freezer overnight), ice-cubes, or sealable plastic containers filled with frozen water. They can be easily carried in cold container or cool bags that you find in the market today. At your canine product supplier you may also find those cloth collars filled with crystals that can be frozen to keep your dog cool. They stay cold for hours and can easily be placed around your bulldog's neck, immediately reducing body temperature at a vital point, close to the brain. When using any type of ice-collar, be sure the collar does not distress the dog any further by being too tight around the neck or too bulky or too cold for too long at a time. Based on the same principle are cooling mats that can be place in the dogs crate or bed keeping your dog cool for hours.

It is always a good idea to take a heatstroke victim to a vet who will check him for shock, a dangerous condition that frequently follows sever heatstroke.

A. Airway

The first step in animal CPR (like human CPR), after determining that the animal is non-responsive, is to obtain an open airway. *You should not continue past A-Airway, until this step has been achieved!*

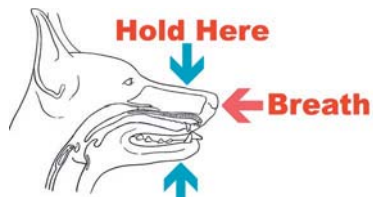
1. Carefully pull the tongue straight out of the animal's mouth to open the airway

WARNING: even an unresponsive dog may bite by instinct!!

2. Make sure that the neck is reasonably straight; try to bring the head in-line with the neck.

WARNING: Do not over-straighten the neck in cases where neck/head trauma exists

3. Attempt 2 rescue breaths, by closing the mouth, and performing mouth-to-nose ventilations. If they go in with no problems continue to B-Breathing.

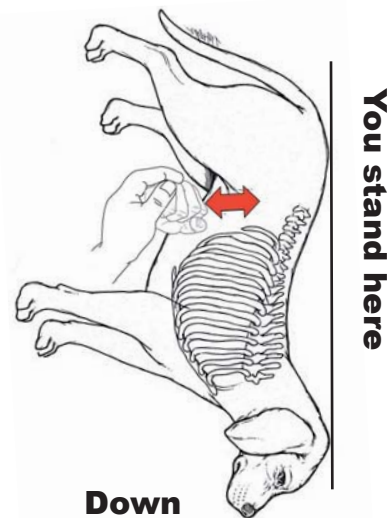


4. If not, reposition the neck and try step 3 again.
5. Visibly inspect the airway by looking into the mouth, and down the throat for foreign objects occluding the airway. Unlike human-CPR, rescuers may reach into the airway and remove foreign objects that are visible
6. If you still can't breath into the animal, proceed to the Heimlich maneuver

A. Heimlich

If you were unable to clear an object from the airway in A-Airway, you will need to do the Heimlich Maneuver:

1. Turn the animal upside down, with its back against your chest
2. Hug the animal with your fist in your hand, just below the rib-cage (for cats, just squeeze 1 hand in the same place)



3. With both arms, give 5 sharp thrusts (bear hugs) to the abdomen. Perform each thrust as if it is the one that will expel the object
4. Stop, check to see if the object is visible in the airway, if so, remove it and give 2 mouth-nose rescue breaths. If the breaths do not go in, go back to step 1

IMPORTANT: Do not proceed with CPR, even if the animal goes into cardiac arrest. You must clear the airway first.

B. Breathing

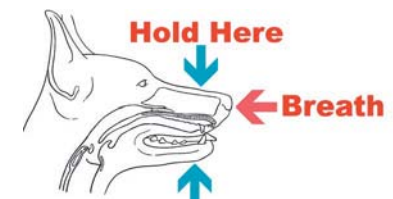
After achieving a patent airway, one must determine whether the animal is breathing, and whether this breathing is effective:

1. Carefully pull the tongue straight out of the animal's mouth to open the airway

WARNING: even an unresponsive dog may bite by instinct!!

2. Make sure that the neck is reasonably straight; try to bring the head in-line with the neck.

WARNING: Do not over-straighten the neck in cases where neck/head trauma exists



3. Breathe at 12 breaths per minute (1 every 5 seconds)

With each breath just make the chest rise (do not overinflate, especially on a small animal)

IMPORTANT: If the breaths do not go in, stop and return to A-Airway!

4. Proceed to C-Circulation, while continuing breathing support as necessary

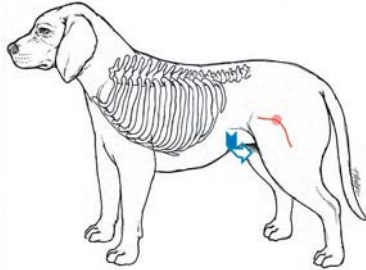

C. Circulation

This is the final step of CPR and should only be started after the A-airway and B-breathing steps have been completed:



1. Make sure that there are no major (pooling/ spurting blood) points of bleeding. Control as necessary by applying pressure with your hand
2. Check for a pulse in the groin (check carefully on a conscious dog or cat!)

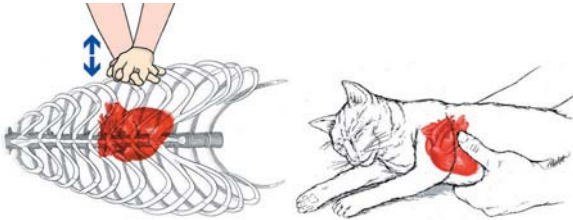


During an emergency it is *very important* that you remain calm. Animals can sense your unease, but cannot understand what is happening and you can't tell them.

Your body language is very important. Be calm, yet deliberate in your actions.

When you determine that you either have corrected the life-threatening problem, or are unable to stabilize the animal, you should transport to the nearest emergency veterinary hospital.

3. Lay the animal on its right side
4. Locate your hands where its left elbow touches the chest, approximately the middle of the rib-cage (for cats use 1 hand in a squeezing motion).



5. Compress the chest 15 times followed by 2 rescue breaths (3 compressions every 2 seconds)

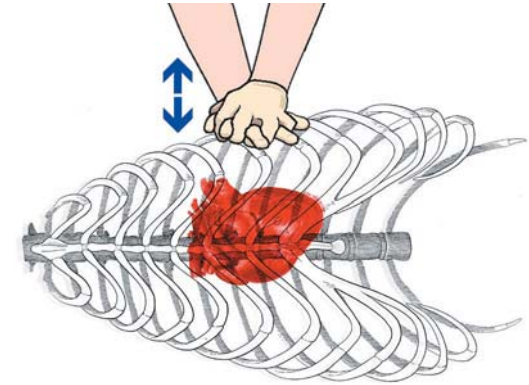
Compress

- 1/2" - small dogs & cats
- 1" - medium dogs
- 1.5" - large dogs

6. Repeat as necessary
